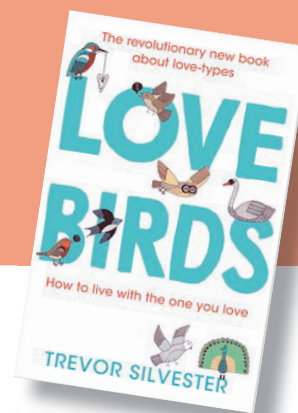


How to live happily with the one you love
